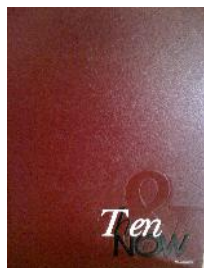

SAT and ACT

During the spring and/or early June, all college-bound juniors should take the SAT and/or ACT test at least once. The dates for these tests are available on our campus website under the Counselor tab, and registration packets for both tests are available in the counselors' office. Students and their parents should pay close attention to the registration deadline dates.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION which CRHS receives will be advertised by a Scholarship Bulletin posted in the Counselors' office and on the CRHS website. This bulletin will be updated throughout the school year. It is the student's responsibility to read the bulletin and come by the Counselors' office for applications. It is extremely important that transcript and application procedures and deadlines to the Counselors' office be met. Other avenues of accessing scholarship information are: libraries, your employer, local organizations, church, and the internet.

Please review it with your child and refer to it often throughout their junior and senior year.

How do I get a TRANSCRIPT?

- Complete a transcript request form (from the Registrar's Office, also available on the CRHS website under "Student Zone")
- Cost is \$1.00
- Official transcript requests **must** be accompanied by a business-size envelope, addressed to the institution, with proper postage and \$1.00.
- Remember – official transcripts **MUST** be mailed from CRHS to the university, scholarship office, etc. in order to be considered official.

Personal transcripts will be ready for pickup in 24-48 hours.

SENIORS: if you and your parents signed the YELLOW release form, you can request transcripts all year without your parent's signature.

Class of 2012 GPA and Class Rank

Seniors received their 6 semester cumulative GPA and Class Rank on Wednesday, September 28th. This included all high school grades earned through the end of summer 2011. The next cumulative GPA and Ranking will be distributed in late January, 2012.

Class of 2013 GPA and Class Rank

Juniors will receive their first official ranking in late January, 2012.

KATY ISD Proof of Residence

KISD requires that the Registrar's office maintain current residential documentation in each student's permanent record. If you have moved, please furnish a copy of a current utility bill (such as electricity, water, or gas) to the Registrar's office.

DANCE TICKET PURCHASES: The rules for getting into the Homecoming dance on October 8th have changed slightly but will be upheld.

TICKET PURCHASES:

1. Your student must have his Student ID in order to purchase his/her ticket.
2. Only ONE GUEST TICKET may be purchased per student. No junior high school students are permitted as guests.
3. All tickets will be numbered, and no duplicate numbers will be assigned to tickets. When your student purchases his/her ticket, the name of your student will be recorded beside the number of the ticket on our records.
4. If the name of the student's guest changes, Sherrie Cooke at sherriecooke@yahoo.com must be notified prior to the evening of the dance.

AT THE DANCE:

1. Your student must have his/her numbered ticket AND his/her Student ID.
2. The ticket number must match the name of the student that purchased the ticket or that of the student's guest.
3. If your student's ID does not correspond to the name recorded by the ticket number, your student will need to purchase another ticket for \$50.00 at the door.
4. Your student's guest must have an ID to enter the dance. The name of the guest must match the name entered on our records beside the ticket number. The guest must have a numbered ticket AND an ID to enter the dance.

TICKET SALES will be held on **October 3-7th, 2011** in the 9GC commons and Main Campus Commons during lunches. Cost is \$ 15.00 per ticket.

Tickets will be sold at the door for \$50.00 each the night of the dance.

Cinco Ranch High School Recycles

This school year, CRHS is participating in a new pilot program for single stream recycling with Greenstar. The program focuses on reducing waste through recycling and by encouraging staff to consider reducing consumption of items that cannot be recycled. Recycling bins are located in classrooms and hallways. Recycling bins use clear plastic bags while trash bins use black bags. What can you recycle?

Plastic: If you look on the bottom of most plastic containers, you will see a recycling symbol with a number. Greenstar will accept containers with numbers 1-7: e.g. Water bottles, plastic jugs, yogurt containers and reusable water bottles.

Paper: e.g. Newspaper, notebooks, magazines, envelopes, hallway passes and cardboard.

Aluminum cans and glass bottles.

Please do not place: Styrofoam, paper towels, napkins, plastic bags, plastic utensils, wax-coated paper drink containers or food in recycling bins.

Ink Cartridges- drop-off in container by the rotunda.

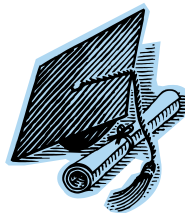

Officials of National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) announced the names of approximately 16,000 Semifinalists in the 57th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 8,300 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$34 million that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship® award, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of the competition. About 90 percent of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and more than half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar® title.
